I am thankful for the many opportunities the Lord gave me throughout the summer to visit with family, friends and supporters in Hawaii, Texas, Ohio and Alabama. Thank you for opening your homes to me.

My summer started with a family trip to Hawaii to say our final "Aloha" to Mom. It was a very special time for our family to reconnect and reminisce our growing up years in Hawaii—we even did some "touristy" things that I had never done before—like hike Diamond Head and Makapu'u Lighthouse trail—what breathtaking views!! After the Hawaii trip I headed to Dallas for a week with family and supporters and then on to Ohio, staying with my sister and her family for several weeks. I also had the opportunity to share with $3^{rd}-4^{th}$ graders about missionary work in Papua New Guinea.



I also visited for a couple of weeks in Alabama. I had a wonderful time with Beth and her family and some of our Selma friends. Beth seems to be doing pretty well at the nursing home. She especially enjoys visits from her family and friends. She has also been blessed with surprise visits from some missionary colleagues we had worked with in PNG. Thank you all for your visits. I know she really cherishes the time you spend with her.

I am back in California, my home base for now. I continue to work remotely from the US with the PNG Literacy section. Working remotely allows me to keep up with my work where ever I go. (However, working from the various time zones can make setting up meetings with PNG a little more tricky since their morning working hours are my late afternoon and evening hours.)

Although I am not in Papua New Guinea in person, I have been closely involved in helping several language teams with their literacy programs. God has truly been working through the various training courses, and the many Scripture story books and other vernacular literacy materials we have been helping teams to produce—I just received these praise reports from the teams that I've worked with:

• There has been an explosion of praise-song writing in Maiadomu, with more than 70 songs recorded, as people have read the Easter and Christmas Scripture Storybooks and community testing copies of the OT Panorama and Luke.



• Three new vernacular schools were formed following the Yamap/Malei Vernacular Creative Phonics Literacy training course that our Literacy trainers ran in February. The newly trained literacy workers now see the value of the Bible translations going on in their areas and are wanting to support it. Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men.... It is the Lord Christ you are serving. Colossians 3:23-24

Prayer Requests:


- Pray for me as I fill in as acting literacy coordinator while our literacy coordinator (Theresa) is away in her village location until mid-Oct.

This is a new course we are developing to help the community with their vernacular literacy. Pray for *safety in travel* and *good health* for the trainers and the participants.
- Pray for wisdom and guidance for the Adzera language team as they do orthography testing in October. A couple of our new Papua New Guinean literacy staff members are from that language area and one of them (Janice) will participate in the testing processes in surveys and an alphabet design workshop, the other one (Wayamo) will travel down at the end of Oct to help edit literacy materials using the updated orthography and spelling decisions. Pray for travel safety and good health for all.
- Pray for Isolde, Erica and Katy as they work in their various language projects as well as serve other language teams at Ukarumpa. And please pray for the staff who are working remotely.
