When I last wrote, I was on my way to Cambodia, the Philippines and Thailand. The three weeks I spent in Asia in September were a great blessing. I was able to visit a family who serves with World Partners in Mindanao (Philippines) and see how God is using them to multiply disciples there. In Cambodia, about 75 believers joined me

for a discipleship workshop designed to help them discover the calling God has given them to fulfill the Great Commission. In Thailand, my ministry partner and I visited young professionals that had previously been disciplined in his church to see how God is using them now that they are scattered in various villages and towns. I also met with many ministry partners in Chiang Mai to encourage them and help them progress in the calling God has given them. Thank you for your prayers for this trip.

In October, Angie and I went to Gatlinburg, Tennessee to celebrate our 30th wedding anniversary. We also visited April, Ted, and Eliana in West Virginia and enjoyed having Emily come to our home during her fall break. Shaun was also able to visit Jacob in Illinois.

Angie is leading a small group for women that meets every other week. She continues to encourage our next door neighbor and ministers to other women and children. Angie's health has been stable. She is now only taking one medication, and her hemoglobin level is staying in the normal range. We are grateful for that!

I continue to mentor and advise people who are leading small groups and engaged in personal discipleship here in Indiana. I also have been helping World Partners and World Ventures develop more effective methodologies to fulfill their missions. Numerous video calls help me to keep in touch with and coach ministry partners throughout Southeast Asia.

Tonight I fly to Asia again for another ministry trip. Here is my schedule:

November 5-6 - Travel to Thailand
November 7-11 - Ministry in Chiang Mai and Lampang (Thailand)
November 12- 15 - Ministry in Kathmandu, Nepal
November 16-17 - Visiting friends in Bangkok, ministry in Chiang Mai
November 18-23 - Ministry in Nha Trang, Vietnam (and surrounding provinces)
November 24 - Ministry in Chiang Mai
November 25 - Return to the USA

In Chiang Mai, I will participate in a board meeting for a foundation I have helped for many years as well as meet with friends and ministry partners. I will preach at two churches, one of which we served at for the first decade of our ministry in Chiang Mai. The other is a tribal church which has asked me to shared at their annual Thanksgiving celebration. Five churches will join together to celebrate God's goodness. In Lampang, I will be leading a training for disciple-makers, leading a workshop for parents, preaching at a church, and visiting with people in the community.

In Nepal, I will be meeting with leaders from various Asian nations. We will be learning from and encouraging one another. In Vietnam, I will be visiting disciple-makers who we have previously trained to see how God is using them. I will also lead a discipleship seminar for people who want to grow in their understanding of Christ-centered, multi-generational discipleship.

Thank you for your continued prayers and financial support for us. Recently, I met with a friend who told me he prays for Angie and me every day. What a blessing! Your partnership with us not only encourages us but strengthens us and allows us to continue serving the Lord in the places He has called us to live and travel to.
